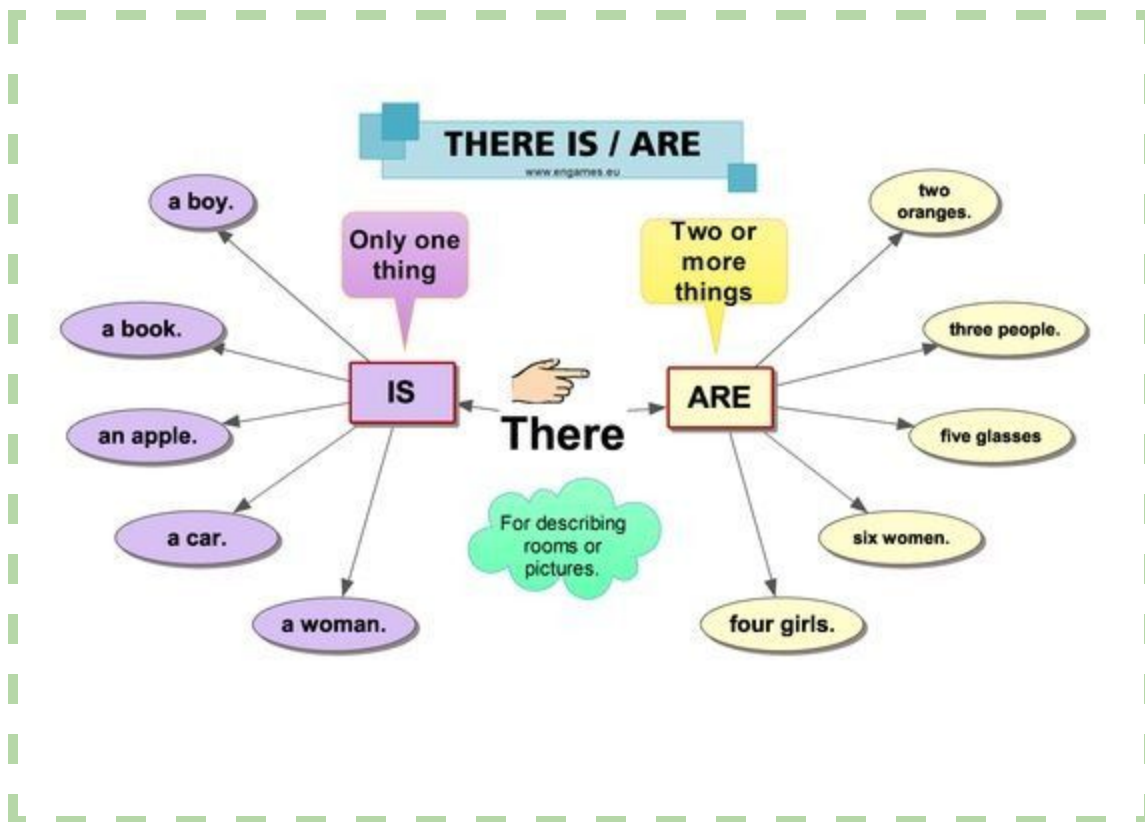


## Week 1: There is/ There are!

Let's remember how to use "there is" and "there are":



**Afirmativa:**

"There is a car", "There are cars".

**Negativa:**

"There isn't a book", "There aren't books".

**Interrogativa:**

"Is there a cake?", "Are there cakes?".

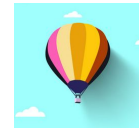
We can describe a lot of things using **THERE IS**, **THERE ARE** and **THERE ISN'T**, **THERE AREN'T**. For example, look at this picture:



A) **There are** four people at the park.



B) **There is** a balloon in the sky.



C) **There isn't** a dog at the park.



D) **There aren't** kids at the park.

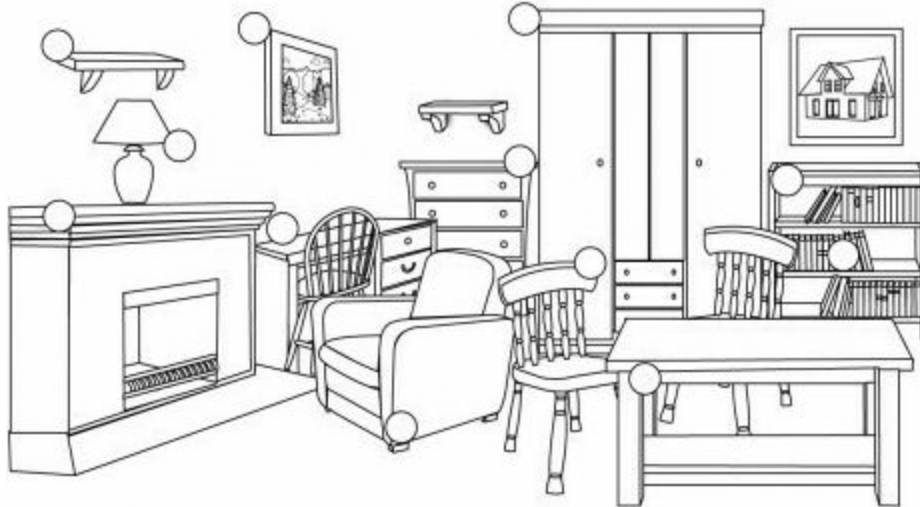
